Temple Sowerby Primary School is looking for a new Chair of Governors to replace Chris Starr whose term of office ends this summer.

The school is very successful with a loyal following, excellent results, a highly committed staff and is well supported by parents and the village community. The school makes use of and supports the work of the Village Hall and the Church as well as working on various projects. Pupil numbers are very good and rising and the school finances are in excellent shape. The school also provides breakfast and after school clubs as well as preschool provision and "Temple Sowerby Tots" for the youngest members of our community.

Whilst you do not necessarily need previous experience of being a school governor, an interest in the welfare of children and their place in a thriving local community are essential. Expressions of interest are welcome from anyone with the enthusiasm and time to devote to help the Headteacher and Governors. The3 person appointed will be subject to a DBS check. The Chair whose term of office is usually 4 years, is required to prepare for and attend one Full Governing Board meeting per term (i.e. 3 per academic year). In addition there are termly meetings of the two smaller sub-committees. You will be supported by the Clerk to the Governors and should be willing and able to deal with email correspondence regarding school matters within a reasonable timescale.

Times are tough and support is needed more than ever by many households. The village has responded very generously, donating over 30 bags of food since the middle of January to the food bank based in Appleby. Speedwatch

Many of you will be aware of the problem of traffic speeding through the village. We are working with the Police to try to find a solution to this issue. However, the Police are keen for us to maintain a regular Speedwatch presence to maintain awareness of this problem. We are currently seeking new volunteers. Speedwatch sessions take place every 2 months or so and last a week. It involves several hourly sessions during that time when we monitor traffic and send the details to the Police. Dogs etc.

A huge thankyou to the many caring and responsible dog owners in the village. However we can be better still. Please remember to pick up poo and take it home with you or drop it into the bins provided. It is extremely harmful to livestock and unpleasant for all.

Please also remember to shut farm gates and keep your dogs on leads at all times. – particularly now that it is lambing time – and also as a consideration to other dogs and their owners and members of the public. The Cumbria Police have just reminded us that it is a crime to worry livestock for which the dog owner can be prosecuted and the dog destroyed. You may not think that your dog is a nuisance but it may react badly when another dog appears. Finally, many people are unaware of the bylaw that states that dogs have to be on leads within 200 meters of a road which includes most of the land around Temple Sowerby.
