Superfast Broadband in Temple Sowerby

Connecting Cumbria is running a programme of workshops to make people aware of the business and social benefits of superfast broadband. This is getting more important as economic and demographic trends across Cumbria are not optimistic and raise significant challenges for us:

• Cumbria population is forecast to decline over the next 20 years.

• 31% of the working population in Eden is earning just the living wage (or less).

• Working Population is declining (by 16% over the next 20 years).

• More people under 30 are leaving Cumbria than staying.

• We are getting older and need more support- the number of people 65+ will increase by nearly 50% and half of people over 65 have a disability or special healthcare needs.

Temple Sowerby already has Superfast Broadband.. Improving internet use shows value and opportunity for people; and also for business creating new career opportunities, with better deals, health and social welfare. Support will be more independent and reduced social isolation can help transform people's lives. Businesses that go online grow faster than those not on line and they create twice as many, better paying jobs.

We also have a midweek team – a blend of youth and experience – competing in a local 20 / 20 Penrith league. James Farmer with the assistance of qualified coaches runs a thriving junior coaching section with over 60 children attending weekly. All clubs need "background staff" and we are fortunate to have groundsmen, tea ladies, general helpers and part time builders, plumbers and mechanics who between them ensure the smooth running of our club. We must applaud our regular sponsors without whom much of our financial development would be
